A-1	AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER	Unusual voice tone, avoid eye contact, frequently repeating noises, avoid loud noises, difficulty expressing feelings

A-1-2	ASPERGER SYNDROME	High intelligence,better than average verbal skills,inability to understand emotional issues,repitive behaviors

A-2	XXX SYNDROME	Delayed development of speech and language skills, learning disabilities, behavioral problems, low motor skills						
A-3	FRAGILE X SYNDROME	Atypical social development, particularly shyness, limited eye contact,intellectual disability, difficulty with face encoding						
A-4	DANDY-WALKER SYNDROME	Increased rate of psychotic spectrum disorders such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, mania or catatonia, intellectual disability						
A-5	PRADER-WILLIE SYNDROME	Mild to moderate intellectual disability, compulsive behaviour, anxiety, psychiatric and behavioural problems.						
A-6	TOURETTE SYNDROME	No visual motor integration and visuconstructive skills, limited intellectual ability, attentional ability, and nonverbal memory

B-1	APHASIA	Inability to comprehend or formulate language, moderate speech repetition, mild difficulty in auditory compehension						
B-1-2	WERNICKE APHASIA	Inability to comprehend or formulate language, mild speech repetition, defective difficulty in auditory compehension

C-3	NIEMANN – PICK DISEASE / NPC Type C	Characteristics from Bipolar disorder, epilepsy, CP.						
C-4	5p- SYNDROME	Severe cognitive, speech and motor disabilities,significant intellectual disability						
C-5-A-1-1	ANGELMANN SYNDROME	Severe intellectual disability, developmental disability, speaking problems, balance and movement problems, seizures						
C-6	EDWARDS SYNDROME	Severe intellectual disability						
C-8-A-1-1	RETT SYNDROME	Delays in gross motor skills, autistic-like features, apraxia, motor problems, seizures, may stop walking						
C-9	SILVER-RUSSELL SYNDROME	Low muscle tone, dwarfism, severe constipation, body assymetry						
C-10	SMITH-MAGENIS SYNDROME	Intellectual disability, facial abnormalities, difficulty sleeping, behavioral problems, self harm

E-1	AMSTERDAM DWARFISM	Developmental delay, Intellectual Disability, Musculoskeletal problems, Social Anxiety, Seizures.						
E-2	DOWN SYNDROME	mild to moderate intellectual disability, physical growth delays						
E-3	EPILEPSY	Depression, anxiety, obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD),seizures, social isolation, learning disabilities, some ADHD characteristics						
E-5	DOOSE SYNDROME	Symptoms of Epilepsy, tonic-clonic seizures, myoclonic seizures, moderate psychomotor retardation, muscle stiffening.						
E-6	DRAVET SYNDROME	Prolonged febrile and non-febrile seizures, autistic-like behaviors, hyperactivity						
E-7	PANAYIOTOPOULOS SYNDROME	Epileptic symptoms, social isolation						
E-8	JOUBERT SYNDROME	Hypotonia, seizures, skeletal deformities
